FOOD WASTE REDUCTION

Terra Preta Organic Waste Collection (guest speaker, Dolph Geurds) talked about how his business started and is using a 3 acre farm. 60% of landfill waste is biodegradable and produces methane gas. Uses static pile composting and 12-18 months later can screen and harvest it. Members get 5 gallon buckets and pick-up is weekly, with a clean bucket. Dolph picks up daily from restaurants and now services all HV schools! Now talking with Bordentown, Lambertville, Robbinsville, East Windsor and Newtown. Key is fungus! End product will be terra preta (black earth). NJ soon will be passing rules on restaurants to compost their food waste. Dolph is in the process of obtaining a composter's license and is working to expand his operation and is well-versed on soil biology.
