The top priority items: paint brushes (all sizes), acrylic paint, canvases, acrylic painting paper, watercolor paper, cardstock (black, white and assorted colors), craft glue guns & glue sticks, paint pens, gel pens Sharpies, Crayola Model Magic & clay, linoleum blocks & carving tools, coloring books (children & adult), word search & crossword books. Limited quantities of other art supplies may also be accepted. Drop them off at Treasure Trove thrift store at 31 West Broad St. in Hopewell Borough, or bring to a HV Green Team collection event at local farmers markets in the summer.
